The Endowment: \$5 Million Goal

Provides critical annual support and long-term sustainability:

- Helps us meet our needs in a precarious arts funding environment
- Provides future financial stability, allowing for new thinking, paving the way for more creativity

Plans for the exterior mural and landscaping, are a part of MOCAD's involvement in the revitalization of Midtown and now the Sugar Hill district. In addition, providing more office space for new employees and upgrading the HVAC system, will further assist in the growth of the museum and its offerings.





Our Albert Kahn Jewel - Our Home

Located in the Museum District, our home has been simply renovated to maintain its historic character. The building was originally designed by famed Detroit architect Albert Kahn. In 2006, architect Andrew Zago adapted the building which currently features artwork by graffiti artist Sean “Nekst” on the south side and a large exterior mural by New York artist Andrew Kuo on the front of the building facing Woodward. This fall we will be debuting a new mural, reimagining the 2007 EVERYTHING IS GOING TO BE ALRIGHT by artist Martin Creed.

The new face of MOCAD will connect art, design, nature, and people to encourage creative experiences and human interactions. Distinguishing MOCAD as a regional cultural destination with beautifully designed spaces and endless possibilities to explore and engage with art in the urban landscape and create a special gathering space for a broadly

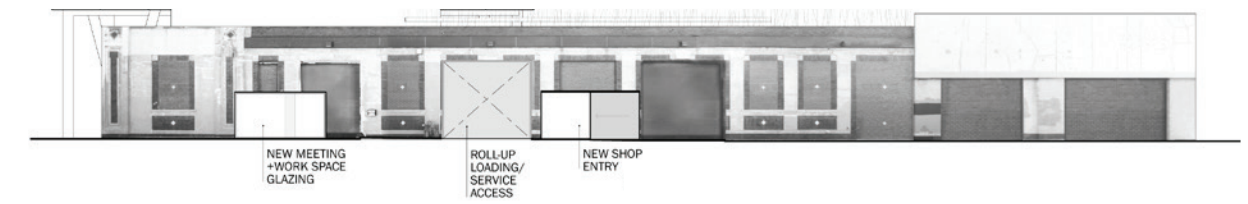
Rather than attempt façade repair/restoration, a new layer is added to the building’s history
